Deliver Customer Savings



- Deliver significant savings by adding up to 200 megawatts of low-cost energy from wind, solar and battery storage through our Renewable Advantage plan
- Freeze base rates through Jan. 1, 2025

Empower the Community



- Make \$4 million in total cash and in-kind contributions to community groups through 2030
- Invest \$2.6 million in lighting to improve safety of streets, parking lots, parks and playgrounds
- Provide an additional \$400,000 in funding for lowincome energy assistance programs for City of Pueblo residents

Power Economic Development and Job Creation



- Invest \$6 million in financial and in-kind contributions for property development in Downtown Pueblo and key commercial areas
- Submit a feasibility study on establishing a new electric rate schedule for businesses producing alternative agriculture products, like hemp
- Contribute \$3.5 million in total cash and in-kind contributions toward economic development activities
- Help Pueblo Units 5 & 6 become a significant driver of tourism and jobs on the Historic Arkansas Riverwalk via sale to a developer and related environmental remediation
- Submit feasibility analysis for a new Black Hills Energy customer service center in Pueblo, allowing redevelopment of existing Downtown Pueblo space

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 Invest at least \$200 million in Black Hills Energy system assets to support continued reliability, currently in the top 25 percent of all utilities nationally


Enable Local Engagement
