NOTICE OF FILING TO CHANGE RATES FOR ALL RATE SCHEDULES AND OTHER TARIFF REVISIONS EFFECTIVE JULY 2, 2021

COLORADO PUC NO. 1 TARIFF of Black Hills Colorado Gas, Inc. d/b/a Black Hills Energy

You are hereby notified that Black Hills Colorado Gas, Inc. d/b/a Black Hills Energy ("BHCG" or the "Company"), 7060 Alegre Street, Fountain, Colorado 80817, has filed with the Public Utilities Commission of the State of Colorado ("Commission"), in accordance with the Public Utilities Law, an advice letter and new tariff sheets to establish rates for new rate schedules under the Company's Colorado P.U.C. No. 1 Tariff for all gas sales and transportation services offered by the Company. This reflects an increase of \$5,331,686 in Rate Area 1, \$4,547,940 in Rate Area 2, and \$4,699,177 in Rate Area 3 for an overall increase of \$14,578,803 above the current annual base rate revenues. The rates, rules, and regulations ultimately authorized by the Commission may or may not be the same as those proposed and may include rates higher or lower than those proposed.

The Company proposes changes in the basic rate structures and the relative amount of revenues collected from each customer class. All rate schedules for gas sales and transportation service are revised for this purpose. The rate schedules are contained in the Company's Colorado P.U.C. No. 1 Tariff and are listed below.

The Company is also proposing to:

- (1) reclassify the Small Volume and Large Volume rate schedules into Large Commercial;
- (2) discontinue interruptible sales services;
- (3) discontinue residential transportation service;
- (4) add Small Commercial Transportation Service to base rate area 3 for conformity;
- (5) add the Monthly Administrative Charge for transportation customers in base rate area 3; and
- (6) provide additional textual changes of a clarifying or housekeeping nature.

Consistent with Commission rules and Colorado statutes, the proposed effective date for the new tariff and associated rates is July 2, 2021.

The projected impacts of the Company's filing on typical monthly bills for Residential customers is shown in Table 1, for Small Commercial in Table 2, and Small Commercial Transportation in Table 3.

The Commission will consider all written comments and objections submitted prior to the evidentiary hearing.

Filing a written objection (protest) by itself will not allow you to participate as a party in any proceeding established in these matters. If you wish to participate as a party in this matter, you must file written intervention documents under Commission Rule 723-1-1401, 4 Colorado Code of Regulations 723-1 or any applicable Commission order. The Commission may hold a public hearing in addition to an evidentiary hearing. If such a hearing is held, any member of the public may attend and make a statement under oath about the proposed tariffs, whether he or she has filed an objection or intervention. If the filing is uncontested or unopposed, the Commission may determine the matter without a hearing and without further notice.
